St Therese's Centenary Year 1922 - 2022



First Reading Mal 3:19-20 A reading from the prophet Malachi

The sun of righteousness will shine on you.

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Gospel Lk 21:5-19 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

The time of God is near. With perseverance and hope let us come before God with our needs and the needs of the world.

We pray for the Church: that God's holy people may ever more courageously witness to the dignity and worth of every man and woman.

We pray for those who are the victims of war and conflict throughout the world: may they know the gift of peace.

On this World Day of the Poor, we pray for the victims of human trafficking, for migrants fleeing from persecution and for those families who bear the loss of family members through separation and death.

We pray for family life, especially parents caring for children or adults with learning disabilities.

We pray for those who are ill, especially Kath Maslin, Andrew Churchill, Fr Tony Cox and Pat O'Dwyer.

We pray for those who have died recently especially Ted Vanderlaan, Sr Mary Dennett and Noel Dunne; We pray for those we remember at this time, especially Ken Stout, Patrick Clifford, Val Lee, Betty Rohan, Jessica Ciccita, Micheline Matranza, Vincent Fitzgerald, the Alderuccio and De Grandi families, Peter Xavier O'Connor.

God of all time, in these days of uncertainty you are our constant hope. Give us eloquence and wisdom as we live out your Gospel and wait with patience for your coming in glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

farical. So its up to ourselves. Unless our record improves, this could easily, and quite reasonably, be our "fifth and final" Youth Week.

We would like to use this opportunity also for a double-barrelled appeal to parents. The first appeal is that they should encourage their teen-age children to attend all the spiritual and social functions for the week. And the second appeal is that they themselves attend the parents' night. In the past this night also has proved somewhat farical. An expert guest-speaker has generally been decidedly unflattered at the attendance.




