First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26 A reading from the book of Exodus

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans.

"If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Responsorial Psalm: I love you, Lord, my strength.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

INTERCESSIONS

Brothers and sisters, as servants of God, let us bring our prayers before the Lord.

That the Church will guide all people in the great commandments of love for God and for our neighbour.

That those responsible for armed conflict in Gaza, Ukraine and other places, may be persuaded to turn from violence to sincere dialogue and peaceful outcomes.

CARITAS AUSTRALIA'S GAZA CRISIS APPEAL The sudden escalation of hostilities in Israel and Gaza since 7 October has seen unimaginable impacts for the people affected by this conflict. The human toll has been devastating with over 6,400 deaths across Israel and Palestine. Over 5,000 Palestinians have been killed so far, nearly half of them are children, while more than 15,000 people have been injured in Gaza. Ongoing bombardments and shelling have destroyed homes, hospitals and essential water and sanitation infrastructure. People in Gaza are in despair with nowhere to run due to a land, air and sea blockade. Since October 11, 2023, Gaza has been under full electricity blackout and critical supplies such as food, fuel and water are running dangerously low - in some areas, they have run out completely. Hospitals are on the brink of collapse as their fuel reserves used to operate backup generators have been almost depleted, endangering the lives of thousands of patients. Around 1.4 million people have been displaced in Gaza with immediate food, shelter, health, and psychosocial needs. The humanitarian situation for people living in Gaza is already dire and worsening quickly with this most recent escalation of violence. With your compassionate generosity, we can support our partners and their local networks on the ground to provide emergency support to people displaced and affected by the most recent hostilities. 


