9 & 10 December: Second Sunday of Advent



First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-5. 9-11 A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Prepare the way for the Lord.

'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

**ARCHBISHOP'S ADVENT APPEAL FOR UKRAINE** In response to the continued conflict in Ukraine, Archbishop Comensoli is launching a special Advent appeal, the proceeds of which will go towards providing aid and practical assistance to those who have been displaced and are without basic supplies, especially as winter approaches. **ADVENT REFLECTIONS BOOKS FOR SALE** "With Expectant Hearts" is a 22-day reflection resource for Advent during the 2023-2024 liturgical year. Each day's reflection is inspired by a short text of scripture, and concludes with a thought or two to take away and with a prayer. This Advent resource invites us to explore more deeply what it means to allow God to come to birth in us. "With Expectant Hearts" aims to help us enter a new liturgical year, the journey of faith that stretches before us. Advent is the God-given time to revisit the challenge and to deepen our understanding of what it means for us both communally and individually. Books are now available to purchase for \$6. They are in the sacristies of both churches (cash only) or you can visit the parish office during operating hours.



**VINNIES CHRISTMAS GIVING TREE** Our Christmas trees serve as a reminder that Christmas can be a difficult time for many people and families. As in previous years, we are asking for donations of GIFTS CARDS instead of toys or gifts. Gifts cards (which cannot be used to purchase cigarettes or alcohol) can be dropped on the collection plates or into the parish office. If you'd prefer to donate cash to the appeal please put it in a clearly marked envelope and drop to our parish office or on the collection plates. Please don't leave and gifts, cash or gift cards under the trees.

**SVDP CONFERENCE NEWS** Beginning in 2024 our two SVDP Conferences of Essendon (St Therese's) and West Essendon (OLN) will combine to form one Conference serving the two parish areas.
